Fund activity during the month

The NAV of the AKD Income Fund (AKDIF) for the month of February appreciated by 2.08% (annualized 30.76%) primarily due to revaluation of debt securities. This resulted in YTD return of 3.36% (annualized 5.09%). The return of the AKDIF was -4.16% for the month of January 2011 and we had advised our investors to remain invested in the AKDIF as this decline was to recover in the future. Partial recovery has been witnessed during the month of February and more is expected going forward.

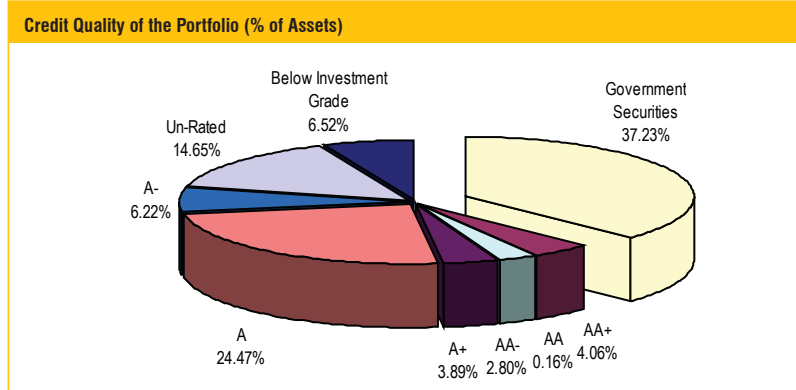
